Homeschool Shakespeare Class 2006-2007

Offered by Mrs. May Fung, ShakeFest alumna of New Jersey Shakespeare Theatre. Please see her full bio on another page. Mrs. Fung also attended the Folger Festivals Workshop for Teachers in the summer of 2005 offered by the Folger Shakespeare Library of Washington, DC.

What?

To get students on their feet rather than behind the desk when they study Shakespeare's work and to prepare them for participating in the statewide Shakespeare Festival held by the New Jersey Shakespeare Theatre and Rider University.

How?

To engage students in voice and movement, and active participation in performing cuttings, scenes or thematic work from Shakespeare's plays.

When?

24 classes from September 25, 2006 to April 23, 2007, classes meet on Mondays from 3:30 to 5:30 p.m.

Who?

Mainly for high school students and mature middle school students. All students will need to schedule an appointment to see Mrs. Fung prior to beginning of class (returning students are exempt from this requirement). Students who are interested in acting will need to prepare either a monologue (10 lines or more), or sing a song that best expresses his/her character. Students who only want to participate in backstage support are still required to schedule an appointment to talk to Mrs. Fung.

Classes will run with a minimum of 12 students and will not exceed 24 students.

Where?

How Much?

Tuition for the full 24 classes is \$120.00. This will include a Stage Combat Workshop run by the NJ Shakespeare Theatre and possibly a Mask Making Workshop. Two to three field trips will be arranged to see performances in the NJ Shakespeare, these are optional with additional ticket charges.

Code of Conducts

Please also inform Mrs. Fung of all absences. Mrs. Fung may consider asking those students who are absent more than two times to discontinue with the class, with no refund of tuition.
- 5. RCCC has graciously agreed to let us use the place without charge, please be respectful of the church property at all times. No running and yelling inside the buildings. Do not touch or operate any audio/visual equipment without the authorization of an adult.

Class Description

The following will be covered during the 24 classes:

- warm-ups and games
- backstage support
- voice training
- body movement
- the Stanislavski method
- scene work and rehearsal for the Shakespeare Festival

Suggested Reading

The following are suggested readings for those who have the time, it is not necessary for students to read any of these in order to participate successfully in the class. However, they should start to read at least one Shakespeare play, if not more, in order to prepare for the scene work. You should be able to find these books and most of Shakespeare's plays in the library.
